

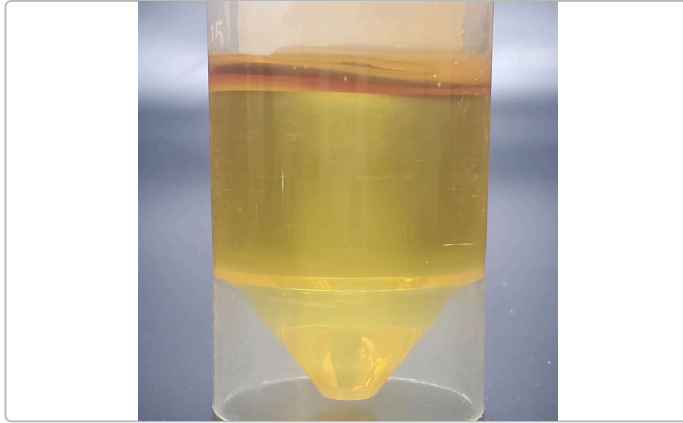

I1	The relative intensity of a characteristic ion in a sample analyte exceeded the acceptance criteria in subsection (L)(1) with respect to the reference spectra, indicating interference
